
8. Report from Mathieu Fleury, Councillor



Action Sandy Hill: AGM May 23, 2019







New Sandy Hill Bus Service


- The new Route 55 will provide a new connection from Sandy Hill along Main Street to the hospital complex on Smyth Road, Monday to Saturday









