
Sandy Hill Spring Plants – Bulbs and More

Bulbs and corms are


underground stems that start

appear.



Daffodils

leaves pop up in lawns and

beds. Some new varieties are

pink or orange with extra

frilly trumpets.





Hyacinths and Tulips

Muscari or grape hyacinths,

larger, fragrant hyacinths

(white, pink or purple) and

early tulips in many colours

start to appear.

More tulips begin to flower.

Other Flowers

Many other flowers begin to


appear, including trilliums,
