### Challenge #1

- I was Canada's first female Senator.
- I used to live in a grand Queen Anne revival style house that is one of the few houses in Sandy Hill to have kept most of its original exterior details.
- I was a strong advocate for refugees and less restrictive immigration policies.

### Challenge #2

- I have an elevator in my home.
- My home is now a National Historic Site.
- I was a Canadian Prime Minister

### Challenge #3

- I was one of Ontario's most prolific female francophone writers.
- I was one of the first female francophone journalists in Ontario.
- In the early 1970s, I used to live on Daly Avenue, but my plaque is two blocks away beside a public building.

### Challenge #4

- I founded the Fédération des femmes canadiennes-françaises.
- I fought for several decades to improve the welfare of francophone women and children.
- I lived most of my life in Sandy Hill, including more than 20 years on Range Road.

### Challenge #5

- I commemorate the creation of Voluntary Aid Detachments during World War 1.
- VAD volunteers provided first aid to soldiers and to the victims of the Halifax explosion and the Spanish Flu.
